Dear Parents and Carers,

In my final letter of the academic year, I wanted to firstly thank you for all of your support for your children and the school community overall across the course of this year. It has been a pleasure for me to get to know you and a privilege to represent Imberhorne School - I have personally really appreciated the welcome you have given me. We have achieved a lot together this year and I hope that you are seeing and feeling this as partners in the same way that we are day in and day out in school. We have some further exciting plans for the year ahead that put the children first, all of which will be grounded within our three-year plan and redesigned vision and values. Looking ahead to September, we have a staggered return to school to support Year 10 (currently Year 9) with their transition to the Imberhorne Lane site and our new Year 7 with their transition to the Windmill Lane site on Friday 5th September. Years 8, 9 and 11 will return on Monday 8th September, with Years 12 and 13 returning slightly later in the week after the completion of enrolment.

We have made the decision not to continue using planners in September and will therefore not be issuing them to students. This decision was made after assessing their usage, which we have found to be somewhat limited, and due to the environmental cost of their production. Homework is still recorded and assigned on Bromcom and can be accessed at home through the MCAS app. To ensure that students have a more permanent representation of their timetable, we will instead be providing them with a small card with this printed on. Week A and B will be printed on alternate sides. Students can also purchase a lanyard for this card should they wish to. We will, however, need to ask for a payment of  $\pounds1.50$  for replacement cards if they are lost.
